You will display your final product and process at the annual ILP EXHIBITION. You will speak with attendees visiting your display for up to 10 minutes per visit. Your exhibit must be <u>visually engaging and informative</u>, and include the following:

- ☐ Your driving question and project outline
  ☐ Your ILP journal
  ☐ A 300 word research overview/conceptual statement. *Please note the following expectations for different ILP streams:* 
  - **Research** 300 word summary of your research methods (e.g. survey, questionnaire, interview questions, observation tool, method, data analysis) and findings
  - **Design** a 300 word overview of research conducted relating to your chosen real-world problem or design
  - **Entrepreneurial** a 300 word overview of research conducted into the existing product market, customer/user wants and needs, and impact or success of final product/service/technology
  - Art 300 word conceptual statement
- **Subject Specific** a 300 word overview of research conducted into your chosen problem/topic ☐ Final product. *Please note the following expectations for different ILP streams:* 
  - Research printed and bound copy of research report (approx. 2000 words), plus reference list
  - **Design** final prototype/product\*
  - Entrepreneurial final product/service/technology\*
  - Art final artwork(s)\*
  - **Subject Specific** final product\*/report (reports must be approx. 2000 words, printed and bound, plus a reference list)
    - \*(N.B. technology-based artworks need to be available for viewing/listening by attendees)

$\square$ A critical reflection on the ILP experience, including discussion of the skills you learnt, and the strengths and weaknesses of your final product – typed, printed and glued in (min. 250 words)

☐ Weekly journal entries
