How to maintain your process journal

A significant portion of your assessment will be based on process, that is, how you go about planning and managing your project. So, it is essential that you maintain a detailed journal. You must update it regularly, recording the date of each entry. This can be in an A4 visual diary, a blog, OneNote, other approved format, or a combination of these. The medium should be appropriate to your project, for example, if you are designing a fashion piece you may want to have a physical journal to record your designs. Your journal must also be able to be accessed each lesson and presented as required by your staff facilitator.

You can use your journal to:

- Explain why and how you chose your particular concept and questions
- Formulate your ideas and intentions
- Outline your thought processes and changes in your thinking
- Indicate your choice of research methodologies and strategies
- Discuss your creative processes
- Focus on new ideas or experimental approaches
- Document alternative views and differing interpretations
- Record your progress at various stages
- Assess any problems that arrive
- Consider any mistakes you may have made
- Work through possible changes of direction in your investigation
- Evaluate technical details
- Analyse conceptual challenges
- Express your own values and beliefs about the topic
- Annotate your growing understanding, insight and personal judgement
- Explain why you chose your particular presentation format
- Record your concept and question development
- Include copies of assessment tasks
- Record key ideas and research findings
- Record your use of creative and critical thinking tools
- Provide evidence of class activities
- Reflect on assessment tasks
- present an annotated bibliography
- etc.
